

CALL FOR CHAPTER PROPOSAL

The Effects of Economic Sanctions within the Russia-Ukraine Conflict

Abstract submission deadline: October 15, 2022

Economic sanctions are used as a policy tool by one or more “sender” countries to force a “target” country to stop or reverse an action. Following the 2014 annexation of Crimea, many countries implemented economic sanctions against the Russian Federation, which in turn enacted counter-sanctions. More recently, a new wave of sanctions took place in response to the Russian military operation in Ukraine.

Objective of this Book

If a large amount of research papers were published since 2014, it is hard to find content that proceeds with scientific popularisation. This book aims at covering the many different consequences of economic sanctions in a way that can reach the largest audience. It aims at covering the two sanction waves (2014 & 2022). It will be written for economists and non-economists who wish to improve their understanding of the impact of economic sanctions on both “sender” and “target” economies.

Subject Fields:

Economics, political sciences, social sciences, philosophy. If your field is missing but relevant to the topic, feel free to submit.

Methodology

There are no restrictions regarding the used methodology. A plausible option for authors is to proceed with the scientific popularisation of one (several) of their research papers. It is also possible to write a chapter based on ongoing research. A particular attention will be given to scientific transparency and ethics.

Submission Process

Researchers are invited to submit a short abstract (up to 300 words) on or before **October 15, 2022**. There are also invited to fill and send the following form with their abstract:

Authors will be notified by **October 31, 2022** about the status of their proposals. Researchers for whom the proposal is accepted will also receive guidelines. Full chapters (3500-7000 words) are expected to be submitted by **January 15, 2023**. All manuscripts will be reviewed on a double-blind review basis. Accepted contributors may also be requested to serve as reviewers for this project. **There are no submission or acceptance fees to this book publication.**

This book is scheduled to be published (hard cover) by Nova Science Publishers, an academic publisher based in Hauppauge, New York, USA. Nova is included in the Book Citation Index and was ranked #13 on the global main publishers list of political sciences, see Arno (2018). Nova was also identified as one of a core of publishers that are indexed in Scopus, CRIStin, JUFO, VIRTAs, and SPI. This “core” contained 46 out of 3765 publishers, see Giménez-Toledo et al. (2017).
